

# Update of the Eurostat Business registers Recommendations manual

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#### 1. Background of the manual

- BR manual contain guidelines supporting development/maintenance of statistical business registers in the European Union
- Manual should help in interpreting the legal basis
- Manual promotes and supports standardisation of content, maintenance processes and uses of SBRs
- Manual should contribute to the elaboration of harmonised European business statistics

#### Focus of the manual is on European requirements



#### 2. Reasons for an update

- Future Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on European business statistics (in legislation process)
- Ongoing developments of the project on the European System of interoperable statistical business registers (ESBRs)
- Adoption and launch of the Data Quality Program for the SBRs
- Recently approved operational rules for the statistical units
- Various further reasons: refinements, clarifications, conceptual and methodological updates, developments in the use and roles of SBRs

#### 5. Relation to other manuals

UNECE Guidelines on Statistical Business Registers (2015)	Eurostat Business registers Recommendations manual (2010)
Broader target population	EU and EFTA countries
Development stage of national SBRs quite different	Development stage of national SBRs not much diverging
Focus on explanations and recommendations for the development of SBRs	Focus on European requirements with the aim of harmonisation
Recommendations not binding	Legal requirements
No differences in the basic concepts between the two manuals

- Drafting of the new chapters mainly during the second half of 2018
- Members of the Eurostat Working Group on Business Registers and Statistical Units are asked to provide comments for each of the chapters when they become available
- Members of the Eurostat BRSU Working Group are asked to provide input on national practices
- Similarly members will be asked to provide comments on the complete draft of the updated manual in spring 2019
- Final comments and adoption of the 2019 edition of the manual in the meeting of the working group in May 2019
